











# Start-Up Materials for Your Family Child Care

When Community Care Licensing conducts your home inspection, their primary concern is that your home is safe for children. Use this list to help prepare for and pass your safety inspection. They will also want to see some basic supplies and materials for children. Use these tips to get an idea of what materials and equipment you should first purchase.

## SAFETY MATERIALS

As you begin the process of turning your home into a child care, focus on creating a safe environment for children. At this stage, your decor or how many toys and materials you have is less important.
